## **Acting on the State of the Union Address**

The State of the Union is an annual message that the President of the United States addresses to Congress, which is publicly viewed on television by millions of people. It is emulated from the Speech from the Throne in the United Kingdom, which is given by the ruling monarch.

According to the Constitution, the President "shall from time to time give to Congress information of the State of the Union and recommend to their Consideration such measures as he shall judge necessary and expedient" (Article II, Section 3). It is used to discuss the accomplishments fulfilled in the previous year and to delineate the President's legislative plan for the upcoming year. The speech frequently includes important matters such as economic health, national security, the housing industry, healthcare, and education.

Writing a well-developed essay as the President of the United States, discuss how you would plan and implement legislation on one of the topics mentioned above to benefit our country in the coming year.

#### Advice to a Presidential Candidate

As the U.S. Presidential election season heats up, the voices of America's diverse citizenry cry out, expressing the people's needs, opinions, and visions for the future. In the midst of all these competing voices, the Presidential candidates have to carefully consider what they say in return. Imagine that you have the opportunity to speak privately to the candidate of your choice before he or she makes an important speech. What would you tell him or her to say to America?

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss the advice you would give to a presidential candidate on a speech to be made to the American public. Include facts and details to support your discussion.

#### **African Imperialism**

Did the rise of nineteenth-century imperialism in Africa have more positive or negative effects? How did these effects transform the continent and the lives of its people?

In a well-developed essay, describe the effects of nineteenth-century imperialism in Africa. Include historical and present day effects to support your description.

#### **American Presidents**

The United States of America has had 43 presidents, all with various strengths and weaknesses. In a multi-paragraph essay, explain who you think was the best American president and why. Make sure to include specific examples and details to support your argument and why.

#### An Ethical Dilemma: Job Recommendation

Imagine that your friend has come to you asking for your help in getting a job at your place of employment. While you know that your friend is not a hard worker and you don't want his/her poor performance on the job to reflect on you, you also don't want to let your friend down because you know he/she needs the money.

In a multi-paragraph essay, describe how you would handle this dilemma. Would you recommend your friend for a job, even though you know he or she would not be a good employee? Be sure to include specific details and examples to support your decision.

## Biography of an Author

Choose an author that you like or one that you would like to learn more about. Then, in a detailed essay, write about this particular author's life. What were some of this author's most significant literary works? What are the most prominent parts of the author's life? What were the times like in which this author lived?

In a detailed and well-developed essay, write about the life and times of a particular author of your choice.

#### **Business Letter to a Restaurant**

Think about your most recent meal at your favorite restaurant. What were the positive and negative aspects of the meal? How could the restaurant further improve its food and service?

Write a letter to the manager of your favorite restaurant in which you provide comments and suggestions regarding the restaurant, service, or food. As you write your letter, be sure to use a format and tone appropriate for a business letter.

#### **Career Goals**

Upon graduating from high school, it is important for students to think about their plans for the future, whether they include additional schooling, joining the workforce, or some other activity.

Think about what you would like your career to be after you graduate from high school. In a well-developed essay, state your career goals for the next five years and explain your plans to achieve these goals.

## Cause and Effect in the Revolutionary War

The events leading up to the outbreak of the American Revolutionary War contain many examples of cause and effect. These can also be seen as instances of action-reaction between the British and the American colonists. 
In a well-developed essay, describe a human trait that you would like to be genetically controlled and the manner in which it is transmitted between generations.

Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, and Judaism are frequently considered the five major religions of the world. Each has unique features including its god(s), key beliefs, origins, sacred text, effect on society, and modern day traditions.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss several of the unique features of one of the major world religions. Include facts and examples to support your discussion.

#### First Day on the Job

Imagine it is your first day at a new job. You want to put your best foot forward because you know that you have only one chance to make a good first impression. How would you accomplish this task?

In a multi-paragraph essay, describe the measures you would take to make a good first impression at your new job. Be sure to include specific details and examples for support.

## **Global Warming**

Global warming has become an environmental issue of great concern. Nations worldwide have been called on to implement policies designed to decrease carbon dioxide emissions. At a grass roots level, it is possible for individuals to make a difference by making lifestyle changes and taking advantage of new technologies.

In a well-developed essay, describe how you and your family can help reduce carbon dioxide emissions.

# **Growing Towards Maturity**

A mature person is one who does not think only in absolutes, who is able to be objective even when deeply stirred emotionally, who has learned that there is both good and bad in all people and all things, and who walks humbly and deals charitably. -- Eleanor Roosevelt

Maturity is a virtue that we all strive for but often find difficult to obtain. It is a quality that we must acquire at some point in our lives as we become adults. What do you think it means to be a mature person?

Write a well-organized essay in which you describe what you think are some of the qualities that make a person mature. Be sure to include specific examples to support your ideas.

#### **Handling Disruptive Behavior**

As a student, you've always experienced a classroom from a student's perspective; however, imagine that you are now the teacher. You are in the middle of teaching the day's lesson, and you have a student who has been disrupting class with inappropriate behavior, such as talking out loud, throwing paper wads, walking around, and not participating with the rest of the class. As the teacher, how would you handle this situation? Would you give detention, send the student to the principal's office, or use some type of creative method to deal with the behavior? Are there classroom management strategies that might prevent situations like this from occurring?

In a detailed essay, discuss how you would deal with this situation. Describe the method(s) you would use to control this student's behavior and classroom management techniques which could prevent this type of behavior.

# **Healthy Relationships**

We experience many types of relationships with our family and friends during our lifetimes. Some of these relationships survive over the years, while others deteriorate. What qualities are important to learn and develop in order to sustain healthy, lasting relationships?

In a well-developed essay, discuss those qualities that you feel contribute to a healthy relationship. Support your answer with specific details or examples from your own experience or reading.

## **Helping a Friend in Math Class**

One of your friends dislikes mathematics and has been doing poorly on homework assignments. He/she has asked you for help.

Write a letter to your friend that provides strategies to be successful in math class. Be sure to provide details and examples.

#### **Historical Periods in Time**

Imagine that you have been given the opportunity to go back in time and live during any period in American history. Which decade of American history stands out as one you would like to witness?

Write a multi-paragraph essay discussing which historical time period you would choose and why. Use specific details and examples to support your response.

# **Importance of Family**

Family plays a valuable role in our lives. Family members are there to provide support and lend a helping hand no matter the circumstance. In all probability, many of the ideas that are now in movies and television shows will one day be in actual use.

In a detailed essay, describe an invention that you have seen in a movie or television show that you would like to see become reality. Include how its overall use will be beneficial for everyone.

#### **Memorable Places**

What place have you visited that you will always remember? It might be close by, or it might be in another part of the world. What was the place like, and why was it special to you?

Choose a place you have visited that was special to you. Write a letter to a friend describing the place and what was special about it. Remember to provide enough details about this place so the reader can picture the place in his or her mind.

# **One-Hundred Years of Change**

Life at the beginning of the twenty-first century is very different from what life was like at the beginning of the twentieth century. Significant changes have occurred in almost every area of life; including space travel, medicine, world politics, communication, and many everyday things we take for granted.

Write an essay describing one significant change that has occurred in the world between 1900 and 2005. Explain the impact this change has made on our lives and why it is an important change.

## **Owning a Business**

If you could operate your own business, what would you choose? It could be anything from a retail enterprise such as a clothing boutique, sporting goods store, or art gallery, to a food service or entertainment business such as a restaurant, coffee shop, or bowling alley.

In a well-developed essay, describe the legacy you would like to include in your family history. Include an explanation for choosing those unique qualities and deeds.




# **Acme Company's Hiring Process (pilot)**


#### Analysis of a Source of News (pilot)

Billy Joel's well-known song "Allentown," released in 1982, tells the tale of a Pennsylvania town enduring economic hardship, as many of its steel factories were closing down. The song attempts to depict the lives of the blue-collar workers during the decline of the manufacturing industry during the

late 1960s and early 1970s. Can you think of a city, either in the United States or another part of the world, that is currently experiencing some type of economic decline?

In a detailed essay, discuss a current city experiencing economic hardship, similar to that of Allentown in Billy Joel's song. Provide details and reasons pertaining to this city's economic situation in your discussion. You may want to conduct research on this topic through the iSEEK search engine, www.iseek.com.

## Black Like Me: Then and Now (pilot)

In 1959, John Howard Griffin, a white journalist exploring the black man's experience in the segregated South, recruited a dermatologist to assist him in artificially darkening his skin by using drugs, sunlamp treatments, and skin creams. Griffin did this so he could travel through Louisiana, Mississippi, Georgia, and South Carolina as a black man. Even people who knew Griffin well did not recognize him with his darkened skin and shaved head. Griffin kept a diary during the weeks he traveled and subsequently wrote the book *Black Like Me*. In his diary and book, Griffin tells of both blacks and whites disapproving of the things he did. He writes about the "hate" stares received from whites, and the scowls received from black bus riders when he offered his seat to a white woman. Most of the general public responded well to his book; however, Griffin received enough negative responses to incite a temporary move to Mexico for safety reasons.

Do you think that Griffin's experiences traveling as a black man in post-civil rights America would be very different from his experiences traveling as a black man in segregated America? How would some of the situations change or stay the same?

In a detailed essay, compare and contrast Griffin's experiences in the segregated South with what he might experience today. Use facts and details about the different eras to support your assertions.

#### **Business: Auto Service Follow-up Letter (pilot)**

Imagine that a regular customer just visited your automotive repair facility. You completed a 30,000-mile inspection and changed the engine and transmission fluids and filters. During the inspection, you noticed that the timing belt and serpentine belt showed cracks.

Write a multi-paragraph letter to the customer in which you summarize the repairs you completed and make recommendations for additional services. Because the customer's knowledge about cars may be different from yours, be sure to use language that the customer will understand as you explain the services clearly.

#### **Business: Develop a Dress Code Policy (Part 1) (pilot)**

Imagine you are a mid-level manager at a growing company. As the company has added staff, some employees have been observed dressing in casual attire. Senior management wishes to establish a

policy regulating how employees dress. It seeks a company-wide policy that is not overly formal, but rather one which sets clear standards and limits the most casual forms of dress. You have been asked to write the first draft of this new policy for the senior management team.

In an organized, multi-paragraph essay, discuss the need for a dress-code policy in your workplace and provide several specific, detailed guidelines. Use reasons and examples to make your recommendations persuasive to the senior management team.

#### **Business: Dress Code Email (Part 2) (pilot)**

Imagine you are a mid-level manager at a growing company. Senior management has officially accepted the dress-code policy you developed. You have been asked to write an email to deliver this new policy to the whole company.

# Call to Action in President Obama's Inaugural Speech (pilot)

Barack Obama assumed the presidency at a time of great uncertainty; when economic and political crises, both domestic and foreign, had shaken the confidence of many Americans. Obama acknowledged these challenges after taking his oath of office and suggested his government was ready to face them, saying, "For everywhere we look, there is work to be done."

Yet, in a manner reminiscent of John F. Kennedy's inaugural petition, ". . . ask not what your country can do for you—ask what you can do for your country," Obama observed that his government alone could not solve all of the nation's problems. Carefully consider this excerpt from Obama's address:

For as much as government can do and must do, it is ultimately the faith and determination of the American people upon which this nation relies. It is the kindness to take in a stranger when the levees break, the selflessness of workers who would rather cut their hours than see a friend lose their job which sees us through our darkest hours. It is the firefighter's courage to storm a stairway filled with smoke, but also a parent's willingness to nurture a child, that finally decides our fate. Our challenges may be new. The instruments with which we meet them may be new. But those values upon which our success depends — hard work and honesty, courage and fair play, tolerance and curiosity, loyalty and patriotism — these things are old. These things are true. They have been the quiet force of progress throughout our history. What is demanded then is a return to these truths. What is required of us now is a new era of responsibility — a recognition, on the part of every American, that we have duties to ourselves, our nation, and the world, duties that we do not grudgingly accept but rather seize gladly, firm in the knowledge that there is nothing so satisfying to the spirit, so defining of our character, than giving our all to a difficult task.

How will you heed this call? What duties can you perform to help America meet its challenges?

Write an essay in which you describe the specific actions that you can take right now to help your nation meets its challenges. How will these actions benefit the nation?

#### **Civil Rights – Kennedy Administration (pilot)**

The Kennedy Administration was subject to influence from several factions in its response to the Civil Rights Movement. In a detailed essay, analyze the ways in which the Kennedy Administration adjusted its response to the challenges presented by the Civil Rights Movement between 1961 and 1963.

#### **Civil Rights – Moderates and Militants (pilot)**

Moderate (SCLC and SNCC) and militant (Nation of Islam, Black Power, and Black Panthers) groups had different views about the value of racial integration, the goals for their race, and the methods for achieving those goals. In a detailed essay, compare and contrast the moderate and militant approaches to the issue of civil rights between the 1950s and 1970s.

#### **Civil Rights – Youth (pilot)**

Teenagers and young adults played a prominent role in the efforts of the Civil Rights Movement. They participated in the integration of Central High School, the integration of lunch counters across the South, and the Freedom Rides. In a detailed essay, analyze the leadership role teenagers and young adults played on the front lines of the Civil Rights Movement during the late 1950s and early 1960s.

### **Compare and Contrast Families of Organic Compounds (pilot)**

Organic compounds are also known as hydrocarbons because their main chemical composition is carbon and hydrogen. Other atoms like oxygen, nitrogen, phosphorus, and sulfur are also important for some groups of organic compounds. Despite the similarities in chemical composition, groups of organic compounds—proteins, carbohydrates, lipids, and nucleic acids—have distinctly different structures and functions. In a detailed essay, compare and contrast groups of organic compounds. Include chemical structure and role in living organisms in your discussion.

#### **Compare and Contrast Newspaper Headline Articles (pilot)**

Newspaper headlines are written to reflect the concerns of readers. Headline articles may report on political, government, sports, local, national, or international news. Using the newseum link, select two different newspaper headline articles from two different locations in the United States. How do the nature of the articles, the perspective of the writers, and the reason(s) for their importance to the location compare and contrast?

In a multi-paragraph essay, compare and contrast at least two headline articles from locations in the United States. Include facts and details to support your discussion.

#### Comparison of "Imagine" and "We Are the World" (pilot)

The classic songs "Imagine" by John Lennon and "We Are the World" by USA for Africa share the theme of hope for a peaceful world. Although the messages of both songs are similar, there are also differences between the two.

In a well-developed essay, analyze the meanings and messages expressed in both "Imagine" and "We Are the World," and then compare and contrast the two songs. Provide examples from both songs to support your comparison.

# **Conservation of Linear Momentum (pilot)**

Linear momentum cannot change in a closed system of particles.

Explain and illustrate the statement above using an example of a system of particles. Use scientific terminology appropriately to describe the particles, center of mass, momentum, internal and external forces, and conservation of momentum.

## **Converting to a New Religion (pilot)**

Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, and Judaism are frequently considered the five major religions of the world. Imagine you were required to change your current religion to one of these major religions. Which religion would you choose? What aspects of this religion appeal to you?

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss your choice of a new religion and your reasons for choosing it. Include facts and details to support your discussion.

# **Create and Describe Electrical Circuits (pilot)**

Electrical circuits need an energy source, a closed path, and a device that uses the energy. The source of the energy can be direct current (DC) like a battery, or alternating current (AC) like electrical outlets in our houses. The closed path through which the energy flows can have devices using the energy arranged in series, parallel, or a combination of the two.

In a multi-paragraph essay, describe an electrical circuit. Include a description of the energy source, flow of energy through the circuit, the devices that use the energy, and the arrangement of the devices in the circuit (parallel, series, or a combination).

## **Description of a Kinematic System (pilot)**

Kinematic systems can be described in terms of velocity, projectile motion, distance, displacement, acceleration, time, and/or direction.

In a multi-paragraph essay, using the appropriate scientific terminology, describe all facets of a kinematic system in detail.

## **Description of a "Natural Leader" (pilot)**

A person who seems in charge of every situation is sometimes called a "natural leader." People often look to such a person to lead them in projects both great and small. Describe someone you have read about who seems to be a "natural leader." Write an essay in which you describe the person and his or her accomplishments so vividly that your readers will feel they know this person.

The quotations by Marden and Stone reflect two very different views about individuals and their environment. Does your environment shape your character, choices, and purpose? Is everything you do a response to your environment or do you shape your environment by your presence, decisions, and existence?

What do you believe? What does your belief reveal about your view of the world around you? In a detailed essay, explain whether you believe that you define your environment or your environment defines you. Include details and in-depth examples from personal experience, readings, and research to support your explanation.

#### **Duality of Humankind (pilot)**

Throughout history, many intellects have perceived the notion of mankind as having an outer self (the side we show for others) and an inner self (a place where our true self lies). In *The Souls of Black Folk*, W. E. B. Dubois saw the African American as living life through a veil. On the outside of the veil lies the surface world and how he is perceived or presents himself, and on the inside of the veil is his true self, where he keeps his most guarded thoughts and aspirations.

In a detailed essay, explain whether you believe it is wise to live a duality of inner and outer self, or better to live as the true person that you are, both inside and out.

#### **Early American Inventions (pilot)**

Imagine that you are living in Philadelphia during the Industrial Revolution (1870s to 1890s). Select an invention that was developed during that time period and write an informational article about the invention for the local newspaper. Your article should describe the invention, define its purpose, describe its positive aspects, and explain how it will improve the lives of the people living in the United States during the Industrial Revolution.

## Earth Systems (pilot)

Earth is a collection of dynamic systems that have undergone significant changes throughout time to become what they are today. Plate tectonics explains many natural phenomena like earthquakes and volcanoes, the atmosphere plays a large role in determining weather and climate, and Earth's water and soil impact the productivity and habitability of the land, among other things.

In a multi-paragraph essay, describe the interrelationships of Earth's systems. Use scientific facts and examples to support your discussion.

#### **Economic Impact of Environmental Decisions (pilot)**

As we become more aware of our impact on the environment, citizens and legislators are faced with decisions which impact local, state, and national economies. For example, government restrictions on construction due to effects on endangered species or wetland areas can affect the employment levels of a community. If you were a citizen or government official facing a decision between environmental protection and local economics, what factors would affect your decision-making process?

In a well-developed essay, discuss the factors which might affect the decision-making process when either the environment or local economics are at stake. Include facts and examples to support your discussion.

# **Economic Impact of Pollution (pilot)**

There are costs and benefits associated with pollution. Although the general public does not desire to live in a polluted world, the economic impact of a pollution-free environment may not be desirable either.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss the economic impact of controlling a form of pollution. Consider including cost-benefit analysis, marginal costs, and sustainability in your discussion. Include facts and examples to support your discussion.

## **Effect of the Black Death in Middle Ages Europe (pilot)**

The Black Death had profound effects on most of Europe during the Middle Ages. Whom did the Black Death affect, and in what ways did people's lives change?

After researching and reading primary documents and other information, write a multi-paragraph essay describing the effects of the Black Death on people's lives in Europe during the Middle Ages. Include facts and details to support your description.

### Effect of the Loss of a Species (pilot)

You have probably heard or read in the news about the concern over extinction of species by habitat loss, pollution, and other anthropological and natural factors. Describe how the loss of a species can have an undesirable effect on the surviving organisms in a food web.

In a detailed essay, evaluate the accuracy of the label "Era of Good Feelings." Include facts and details to support your evaluation.

## **Evidence for Evolution (pilot)**

There is modern-day evidence that supports the theory of evolution. Changes in plant and animal organs and populations have been observed and documented, and improvements in technology have enabled more accurate dating of fossils, showing change in vertebrates over time. However, despite these data, there is still skepticism about evolution.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss evidence that supports and refutes the theory of evolution. Use scientific facts and examples to support your discussion.

# **Exchanging Your Right to Vote for a Comfortable Life (pilot)**

As a citizen of the United States, you will soon be old enough to vote. When you are of voting age, would you be willing to permanently give up your right to vote if someone guaranteed you a comfortable life (a good job, lots of free time, and other services)?

Use details from the math problem that you solved to fully support your discussion of the four steps listed.

## Faraday's and Lenz's Laws (pilot)

An electric current can be produced by a change in magnetic flux surrounding a conductor. Faraday's Law and Lenz's Law explain the magnitude and direction of the induced current. How can these concepts be demonstrated?

# Father and Son in Chapin's "Cat's in the Cradle" (pilot)

There are many types of books and literature available to readers, including creative adventures, science fiction, autobiographies, and poetry. In a detailed essay, describe your favorite literary genre and why you enjoy it.

### Formula for Intelligence (pilot)

"Knowing a great deal is not the same as being smart; intelligence is not information alone but also judgment, the manner in which information is collected and used." – Carl Sagan

There are many aspects that play into a person's intelligence that go beyond academic learning. Factors such as life experience, emotional control, and decision making will also play a major role in the completion of one's intellect. Imagine that you were asked to create the formula for an intelligent person. What are some of the key components a person would need to achieve intelligence?

# **Genetic Disorders (pilot)**


The use of pedigrees to trace genetic disorders in families has improved the understanding of the inheritance patterns associated with these disorders.

## **Geometry in Structures (pilot)**




# **Healthy Life Expectancy (pilot)**

Global studies increase our awareness of the change and diversity present all around us. In a multiparagraph essay, discuss instances where change or diversity has affected your life. Include details and examples to support your discussion.

#### **How Do You Know This is a Rotation Problem?** (pilot)

You are taking a physics exam, and you are stuck on a certain problem. You suddenly realize that torque is central to the problem, and then you are ready to solve it.

Using appropriate physics terminology, explain why torque was a sure clue to the nature of the problem, and propose a strategy or strategies for solving it.

# **Hurdles for a Political Outsider (pilot)**

In the 2008 Presidential election, marked by many historic firsts, Alaska Governor Sarah Palin has found herself abruptly thrust into the national spotlight. While the months leading to the national election promise to be grueling for all of the candidates, this will be especially true for the candidate from Alaska, who emerged from the geographic isolation of Alaskan politics to compete on the national stage as a Washington "outsider."

In a well-organized essay, discuss the biggest hurdles you think a candidate who is a Washington "outsider" would have to overcome during a national election. What advice would you provide to this candidate to help him or her run an effective and successful campaign? Be sure to support your discussion with examples and reasons drawn from your studies and observations.

### **Impact of DNA Discoveries (pilot)**

The discoveries of the existence, structure, and function of DNA have had significant impacts on scientific thought since the mid-1900s. Transmission and expression of genetic traits and insight into the origins of humankind are now better understood.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss the scientific ramifications of the discoveries of the existence, structure, and function of DNA. Use appropriate scientific terminology and details to support your discussion.

## **Impact of the Declaration of Independence on History (pilot)**

The Declaration of Independence is considered one of the most important documents in the history of the United States. Its key ideas and principles have had a profound effect on the course of history.

In a well-developed essay, discuss how the key ideas and principles of the Declaration of Independence have changed history. Include facts and details to support your discussion.

#### **Importance of Career Fairs (pilot)**

Many schools sponsor a Career Fair where students can discuss career opportunities with persons who work in different professions. Think about the benefits of attending a Career Fair. Now write to explain the benefits of attending a Career Fair.

# **Important Modes of Transportation (pilot)**

Many modes of transportation are used in the world today. Goods and people around the world move from place to place by automobile, bicycle, airplane, horse, boat, train, and many others. Which mode of transportation do you think is particularly important? How is this type of transportation helpful or valuable?

Write an essay about one form of transportation used in our world today. Describe what it is used for and why you think it is especially significant.

## **Industrialization and Imperialism (pilot)**

After successfully assisting the government of Country X in creating a new Constitution, the Prime Minister has hired you to be her Chief of Staff. Your primary role is to serve as her personal advisor. Country X has been industrializing its economy, which has created many new challenges for the government and people of Country X.

The Prime Minister has asked you to use your knowledge of history to inform her of the issues Country X now faces as a result of industrialization. As her Chief of Staff, you must present a well-written multi-paragraph essay that includes an introduction, supporting paragraphs, and a conclusion. In particular, you must explain to the Prime Minister the positive and negative effects of each of the following main issues:

- Country X's lack of natural resources (i.e., imperialism)
- Social implications of industrialization (e.g., plight of workers, etc.)
- Expectations for political and economic changes



Then, attend a sports practice or game at your school and, at its conclusion, interview one player. Write the interview in a question-and-answer format.

Transcribe that interview into a question-and-answer story.

### **Jacksonian Democracy (pilot)**

During this period of great technology and growth for America, the poor, common worker faced both old and new challenges. The character of John Henry would later be used as a symbol by many poor and disenfranchised workers asking for better treatment and equal rights. Several versions of his tale are told, and this story has become one of the most popular ballads in American history.

After reading the tale of John Henry, in a detailed essay, describe why the folktale of John Henry became such an important symbol for the American worker and the struggle for equality. Use details and examples to support your response.

## **Knowledge of Historic Events (pilot)**

Historic events take place around the world almost every day. We become aware of these events by reading a newspaper, watching television news, or surfing the Internet. We are able to study these events, past and present, through artifacts, history books, or other recorded sources. In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss the sources we turn to for our knowledge of historic events. Include details and examples to support your discussion.

## "Living for the City": A Look at Poverty and Racism (pilot)

"Living for the City" is a 1973 hit song by Stevie Wonder that explores the themes of poverty and racism by telling the story of an African American boy and his family. The song brings forth the various social conditions that impacted African Americans in the United States during the 1950s and 1960s.

In a detailed essay, analyze the meaning of this song stanza by stanza in connection with the social and economic conditions surrounding African Americans during this time in history. Also analyze the meaning of any figurative language used in the song, and cite lyrics from the song to support your analysis. You may want to conduct research on this topic through the iSEEK search engine, www.iseek.com.

# Magnetic and Electric Fields Affect Each Other (pilot)

Introduction of a magnetic field into an electric field will have a predictable effect on the electric field. The same is true of the introduction of an electric field into a magnetic field.

In a detailed essay, describe the effects that a magnetic field can have on an electric field and an electric field can have on a magnetic field. Be sure to use appropriate scientific terminology and include all pertinent details in your description.

### **Managing Your Personal Finances (pilot)**

A wide variety of subjects and topics are taught in today's schools. However, courses in personal finance may not be offered, and they are certainly not required for graduation. As a result, many of today's young adults graduate high school (and even college) knowing very little about how to manage their money, including how to balance a check book, differentiate between credit and debit, and invest for the future. After participating in a class or viewing a video on personal finance, how has your understanding of handling your personal finances improved? What plans will you make or actions will you take as a result?

In a well-developed essay, discuss the class or video topic on personal finance. Include what you learned and how it will impact your personal finances.

## **Martin Luther King Jr. (pilot)**

Throughout history, citizens have struggled with such issues as slavery, religious persecution, and resistance to war when their consciences demanded that they act in one way while the law demanded they act in another. Breaking the law in order to do what one considers right is an act of civil disobedience. Martin Luther King Jr. raised precisely this issue in his "Letter From Birmingham City Jail." He had been arrested for violating the law in protest of racial segregation in the American South.

Relying on your reading of the passage or outside research, write an essay in which you describe an instance in which Martin Luther King Jr. practiced civil disobedience. Be sure to address both sides of the issue. In the instance you discuss, do you think civil disobedience was an appropriate response?

# **Mathematics in Music (pilot)**

"Music is the pleasure the human mind experiences from counting without being aware that it is counting." –Gottfried Leibniz

In a well-developed essay, explain how both the composition and performance of music utilize mathematical concepts. Be sure to provide specific details and examples.

### **Mathematics—Simplifying the Complex (pilot)**

In a well-developed essay, explain how mathematics has been used to make complicated things simple. Be sure to provide specific details and examples as a part of your explanation.

# Math Video Improves Understanding (pilot)

We are not usually asked to describe or discuss math concepts except in a math class, and we are very rarely asked to write about them. However, writing about math concepts can improve learning, reinforce our understanding of the concepts, and strengthen our understanding of the vocabulary and terminology. After viewing a math video, think about the new concepts introduced, how they relate to what you have already learned, and how you will use them in the future. How was the video able to illustrate the concepts to improve your understanding?

In a well-developed essay, discuss the math concepts of the video and how the video impacted your understanding of those concepts. Include facts and details to support your discussion.

In a well-developed essay, describe what this photo means to you.

#### **News Through New Media (pilot)**

"Extra! Extra! Read all about it!" In classic films, the local newsboy sells newspapers at the corner with those words. In the past century, the delivery of news has changed dramatically. What parts of the cell are responsible for selecting only certain molecules and rejecting others? What specialized chemicals are produced by the cell to break down food molecules into substances suitable for cellular nourishment?

#### Person You Have Studied (pilot)

Throughout your years in school, you have studied about many different people. Think about one of these people you have studied during your time at school. What makes this person special enough to study?

Write an essay in which you discuss a person you have studied in school. Explain what it is about this person that is special. Use details and examples to support your ideas.

## Perspective on War in "Dulce et Decorum Est" (pilot)

Individuals' attitudes toward war often change depending on their unique circumstances, perspectives, or levels of participation in a conflict. Oftentimes a person's direct experience of war will change his or her attitude toward the conflict. Wilfred Owen's poem "Dulce et Decorum Est," one of the great World War I (WWI) poems, paints a vivid picture of the horrors of war from a soldier's perspective.

After reading and researching the poem "Dulce et Decorum Est," write a multi-paragraph informational/explanatory essay about how the author's experiences in WWI influenced his perspective on war. Be sure to identify the author's perspective on war and explain how the events of WWI influenced this perspective. Remember to use multiple sources to inform your response.

## **Perspectives on Race (on pilot)**

Race can be defined as a group of individuals who share a common culture or history. As members of society, we interact with people from different races all the time. We form opinions from our personal experiences and from the stories we hear from our family members as well. What perspectives have family members shared with you about race? Do their perspectives align with what you think about people from other backgrounds? If so, how? If not, how do the perspectives differ?

In a multi-paragraph essay, explain your family members' perspectives on race. Then, compare and contrast your family members' perspectives about race with your own. Be sure to include specific details that support your ideas so the readers can fully understand your family members' perspectives on race.

### **Phylogenetic Classification (pilot)**

Phylogenetic trees graphically represent evolutionary relationships between animal groups based on their physical and genetic characteristics. An understanding of these relationships provides data on evolution, information on extinct species, and the basis for classification.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss the use of a phylogenetic tree to further our understanding of the relationships between animal groups. Include scientific facts and examples to support your discussion.

## Plato's View of Knowledge (pilot)

"And what, Socrates, is the food of the soul? Surely, I said, knowledge is the food of the soul." - Plato

In a detailed essay, describe what you believe Plato meant about the importance of knowledge, when he made the statement above to his friend Socrates.

#### **Positive Outcome from Failure (pilot)**

"...people succeed because they understand that you can't let your failures define you-you have to let them teach you. You have to let them show you what to do differently next time."

- President Barack Obama, Broadcasted Speech, September 8, 2009

Reflecting on this quote from President Obama's speech, think of a time when the lessons learned from a failure led to a more positive outcome. Be sure to include specific, relevant details and examples so

readers can picture the situation in their minds.

# Poverty and Equality - Past and Present (pilot)

As a historian, you have been tasked with researching poverty and equality in America to see if the problems of the Gilded Age (i.e., the late 1800s through the early 1900s) persist today. Once you have formed your opinion, write an article for the Journal of American History that compares and contrasts the poverty and inequality of the past with the realities of the present. Support your opinion with evidence from documents used in your research.

### Power: Attaining, Maintaining, and Losing It (pilot)

There are many examples in history of individuals or groups attaining, maintaining, and losing power. How did these groups or individuals rise to power? What led to the downfall of some and the success of others?

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss how power is attained, maintained, and lost. Include specific examples from history to support your discussion.

# **Practical and Future Uses for Capacitors (pilot)**

Capacitors use conductors and insulators in the form of dielectrics to store energy. Capacitors are found in most electronics, such as to supply backup energy when changing batteries. Although currently the amount of energy that can be stored is relatively small, plans for future uses of capacitors include quick cell phone recharging.

In a detailed essay, describe a capacitor and its construction, explain how it works, and discuss possible uses for it. Include appropriate scientific terminology and facts in the description and explanation.

#### **Predator-Prey Relationships (pilot)**

Predator-prey relationships can be subject to coevolution and can result in disastrous effects to an ecosystem if disturbed. The adaptation of the prey species to defend against predators ranges from morphological defenses to protective coloration. The loss of a prey or predator species can disrupt an entire ecosystem and have economic ramifications.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss predator-prey relationships, including defensive adaptations by prey and the effects of disruption of that relationship on an ecosystem. Include scientific facts and examples to support your discussion.

# Press Release on Gregor Mendel's Findings (pilot)

Modern genetic understanding can be traced to the early work of Gregor Mendel. Write a press release outlining Mendel's findings and contributions concerning pea-plant genetics.

# **Principles of Electrostatics (pilot)**

In a detailed essay, explain the differences between electric forces, electric fields, potential energy, and potential. Use appropriate scientific terminology and examples to illustrate the concepts.

# Profile a Coach (pilot)

Many believe that coaches are the most influential-and their coaching techniques the most critical-at the high school level, when athletes are still learning the game.

Attend an upcoming game at your high school. Observe and interview the coach. Then, write a well-developed feature story about the coach. Include details of how he/she got started coaching, what his/her coaching philosophies are and what he/she thinks is the most important thing to teach a high school athlete. #### **Progressive Reform (pilot)**

The plight of the worker, especially in the steel, railroad, and mining industries, received enough attention in the Progressive Era to result in the passage of safety regulations. In a well-developed, multi-paragraph essay, identify issues regarding worker and consumer safety that progressive reformers addressed. Explain how different levels of government investigated problems and then passed legislation in order to protect workers and consumers. Include facts and details to support your discussion.

### **Prom Dress Code (pilot)**

The senior prom is a very special event. One of the reasons why it is so special is because everyone attending gets to dress in formal attire. School administrators present prom goers with a dress code and sometimes inspect student attire for appropriateness as they arrive. What is considered to be appropriate attire for a prom? What rules would you suggest for the senior prom dress code at your school?

In a well-developed essay, describe the dress code you would suggest for the senior prom. Include facts and details to support your description.

### Propaganda Posters of WWI and WWII (pilot)

The government used many different methods to encourage public support for the war effort during World War I and World War II. One of the more effective tools used to affect public opinion and encourage support during both wars was the propaganda poster. How did the federal government use posters to shape the opinions and behavior of the American public during WWI and WWII?

In a multi-paragraph essay, analyze the similarities and differences in the government's messages to the American public during WWI and WWII, as exemplified by the use of propaganda posters. In your discussion, include the methods used by poster artists to convey those messages.

# **Public Participation in Campaigns (pilot)**

Candidates for the presidential election of 2008 have been using the Internet and technology in new and innovative ways. They are using blogs and websites to get out their messages, and, in a new twist, the public has been invited to submit questions for candidate debates and design video campaign ads. What elements would you include if you were designing a video ad for a favorite candidate?

In a well-developed essay, describe the video ad that you would design for a presidential candidate. Include facts and details to illustrate your ideas.

#### **Qualities of Our Elected Officials (pilot)**

Many people criticize the officials that are elected to our federal, state and local governments. They disagree with their political, economical and/or ethical views on the most prominent issues. Since we, the people, have the right to choose our leaders, what qualities would you look for in a qualified candidate?

Write a multi-paragraph essay in which you discuss the most important characteristics you think an elected official should have. Support your answer with specific details or examples from your own experience or reading.

### Reflections and Advice for the Teenage Years (pilot)

It has been said that the teenage years can be some of the most challenging years in a person's life. Reflecting on your own experiences, what is the hardest part of being a teenager today? What is the best part? What advice would you give a younger sibling or friend about the challenges of the teenage years?

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss your reflections of the teenage years and offer advice to younger people based on your experiences.

## Relationships between Work, Energy, and Power (pilot)

Using a horse, a dog, a wagon, and two hours, create a scenario that illustrates energy, work, the work-energy theorem, and conservation of energy, forces, and power. Use appropriate scientific terminology and include details in your descriptions.

### **Response to a Will Rogers Quote (pilot)**

"Never let yesterday take up too much of today." - Will Rogers

What do you think Will Rogers is saying in this quote? Do you agree or disagree.

In a multi-paragraph essay, explain why you agree or disagree with Will Rogers's quote. Be sure to include examples from literature, history, science, film, or your own experience or observations.

# Role of Women in WWII (pilot)

Women supported the war effort during World War II in many different ways, ranging from joining the military to assuming traditionally male roles in industry, agriculture, and various professions. In a detailed essay, discuss the reasons and ways women supported the war effort during World War II as consumers, industrial workers, and members of military units?

#### **Science Video Provides Perspective (pilot)**

Some scientific processes take place lightning fast, often involving microscopic elements inside a body or an object. With video, the processes we cannot replicate in a lab or classroom are illustrated through computer graphics, slow-motion photography, and live film footage. How did the video that you viewed allow you to better understand a specific scientific concept or process?

In a well-developed essay, discuss the scientific concept or process in the video and how the media used in the video improved your understanding. Include facts and details to support your discussion.

### Science Without Religion and Vice Versa (pilot)

"Science without religion is lame, religion without science is blind." - Einstein

Do you agree with Einstein's statement? In a well-developed essay, articulate your position on this issue. Be sure to provide specific details and examples to support your argument.

### Season Preview (pilot)

Excitement always surrounds the start of a new sports season. Every team dreams of winning a championship. Writers can use the past performance of a team-coupled with information about current players and performance trends-to predict how a team will perform over the course of a season.

Attend an upcoming pre-season practice at your school, and interview the coach about expectations for the upcoming season. Ask the coach about which areas the team has improved in the most since last year. Ask which areas they are still working to improve. Combine those details with the facts and statistics you've researched from the previous season to predict how the team will do this year. To review an example of a preview, you can go to the <u>DS Report Season Preview example</u>.

# **Senior Profiles (pilot)**

Senior leadership is critical to the success of a high school sports team. Often, the most influential seniors aren't the ones who get the most playing time. The team leader can instead be someone who works hard every day in practice and is a positive presence on the sidelines.

Attend a sports practice or game at your school and ask the coach which non-starting senior provides the most leadership. Then, interview one of the underclassmen on the team to find out what that player's dedication and leadership has meant to him or her. Van Gogh's "Starry Night," painted in 1889, is his most famous work of art. The image depicts a night sky with stars and swirling clouds, with a large mysterious structure to the left of the painting and a residential town underneath the night sky. In a detailed response, discuss this past summer, including new experiences or things you wish you could have done before school resumed. Be sure to support your discussion with specific details and descriptions.

# **Summertime College or Career Preparation (pilot)**

As a high school student you may be planning to prepare for college or career with summer activities. There are many things a student can do during the summer, like taking part in a special summer program for high school students at a college or university, participating in a volunteer program, enjoying suggested summer reading, or working in your future occupation or trade.

In a detailed essay, discuss your ideas for a productive summer vacation and how it can be used to help prepare for college and/or your future career. Include examples and details to support your discussion.

# **Supplies to Travel the World (pilot)**

Imagine you are setting out to discover the world on your own. If all you could take with you had to fit into a backpack, what would you take? How would you use each item? Do you think you would eventually carry more or less as you traveled? Why?

In a multi-paragraph essay, describe the items you would carry in your backpack as you traveled to discover the world.

## Taking Advantage of an Opportunity (pilot)

"I held a moment in my hand, brilliant as a star, fragile as a flower, a tiny sliver of one hour. I dripped it carelessly, Ah! I didn't know, I held opportunity." –Hazel Lee

# The Church in the Middle Ages (pilot)

During the Middle Ages, the Church played a powerful role in the government of Europe and in defining the lives of many Europeans.

In a well-developed essay, identify and discuss events that led to the decline of the power of the Church in the period from 1000 to 1500 AD.

## The Effect of Public Opinion on Trials (pilot)

Recently, many high-profile court cases have caught the public eye, such as the trials of O.J. Simpson, Michael Jackson, Scott Peterson, and most recently Saddam Hussein. Is it possible that increased public attention has affected the outcome of these trials?

Write a multi-paragraph essay in which you discuss whether or not you think public opinion can have an effect on the verdict of a trial. Be sure to include specific details and examples to support your analysis.

### The Effects of the Watt Steam Engine (pilot)

In the late 18th and early 19th centuries, the Industrial Revolution triggered a major shift in human history. Many historians say that this era began with the invention of the Watt Steam Engine, which led to many changes in transportation, communication, and business.

Imagine you were alive during the time of the Industrial Revolution and have just witnessed a demonstration of the Watt Steam Engine. In a letter to one of your friends, describe what changes you think this invention will bring about for the world.

#### The Elegance of Cell Division Processes (pilot)

Higher organisms need to have both diploid and haploid cells. The processes of mitosis and meiosis provide these cells in very elegant fashion, ensuring genetic variability in a population and enabling repair of damaged tissue and growth of organisms.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss the similarities and differences of the processes and products of meiosis and mitosis. Use appropriate scientific terminology and details to support your discussion.

## The Holocaust: Aftermath (pilot)

Allied forces on both the Eastern and Western fronts liberated numerous concentration camps as the Second World War wound down. As the enormity of the Holocaust became apparent, many attempts were made to punish the Nazis who implemented Hitler's policies of genocide. Punishment ranged

from the famous Nuremberg Trials to the attempts of "Nazi-hunters" to track down Nazis who had fled around the world.

Using the Internet, books, or other resources, gather research about some of the ways in which the Allies attempted to punish those responsible for the Holocaust. Then, write a well-developed essay in which you present this information. What relevance do these attempts at justice have for the world today?

## The Human Population (pilot)

The rate of population growth depends on many factors, and it has increased steadily in many countries since the 1800s. In developing countries, the increased rate of population growth is problematic, while in developed countries, the decreased rate of population growth is problematic.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss the causes of population growth and decline and the impact of the rate of population growth on the overall health of a country. Use facts and examples to support your discussion.

### The Importance of Math in Travel (pilot)

Transportation is one of the most important aspects of modern society. Math plays an important role in planning for and traveling effectively. In a detailed essay, discuss some of the important ways that math is used in travel.

#### The Lives of Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman (pilot)

Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman are two of the most famous African Americans in history. Both were prominent abolitionists who escaped slavery and helped lead numerous other slaves to freedom during the time of the Civil War. Although Douglass and Tubman share many similarities, they also have some differences between them, such as in the way in which they escaped slavery.

In a well-developed essay, compare and contrast Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman, explaining their similarities and differences. Provide facts and examples to support your comparisons.

#### The Many Types of Waves (pilot)

Waves are defined as traveling, standing, sound, and light. They can interfere, diffract, reflect, and refract. We use these different types of waves and their properties in many ways, from mirrors and eyeglasses to speakers and amplifiers.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss waves, their properties, and the application of these properties in our everyday lives. Include appropriate scientific terminology and details to ensure a comprehensive discussion.

## The Shaping of America (pilot)

There have been many people and events that have shaped America's past and present. Although we tend to think of notable historic events and famous people, our own family members have been involved in shaping our country. What has happened in your life or in the life of one of your family members that tells a story about the shaping of America? Why do you think this story is important in telling the history of the country?

In a well-developed essay, describe an event that you or someone in your family experienced that tells a story of the history of America. Be sure to include details about the time period, facts, examples, and quotes from your family members for support.

### The Three Components of Cell Theory (pilot)

In your own words, explain the three components of the cell theory, which is a basic concept of biology.

Be sure to include facts and examples to support your discussion.

## The Value of Video on Different Countries (pilot)

While photos and stories about other countries give us a glimpse into the lives of the people of that culture, video enables an even greater view. With video, we can experience interactions between people, entry into unfamiliar places, and participation in events as if they are happening right before our eyes. How did viewing a video of another country supplement your understanding of that country and its people?

In a well-developed essay, discuss the video on another country and describe how it supplemented your understanding of that country. Include facts and details to support your discussion.

# The Year in Review (pilot)

The coming of a new year always prompts nostalgia and a look back at all the things that happened during the current year. Societal, economic, cultural, political, and other kinds of events can have a major impact in just one year. What changes have affected you?

In a well-developed essay, discuss the highlights of economic, social, cultural, political, and world events that impacted people during the course of the year. Be sure to include specific events and illustrate their impact on society.

## **Uniquely American Benjamin Franklin (pilot)**

In *The Autobiography of Benjamin Franklin*, Franklin describes his life experiences through the jobs he held, inventions he created, publications he printed, and political and social philosophies he developed. Franklin has since become an American icon of the period.

In a multi-paragraph essay, describe the characteristics of Franklin's personality and lifetime accomplishments that make him uniquely American. Include facts and details to support your description.

## **Use of a Hydrostatic System to Stop a Car (pilot)**

Hydrostatic systems have interesting properties relative to pressure and force. These properties are put to use in the design of automobile hydraulic brake systems.

In a detailed essay, explain the properties of hydrostatic systems, which make it possible to use pressure on a brake pedal to stop a car. Use appropriate terminology and details to illustrate your explanation.

#### **Uses of Nuclear Physics (pilot)**

Nuclear physics developed with our understanding of the particles composing an atom. Imaging for medical and security purposes, energy production, and military weapons has been developed using advances in nuclear physics.

In a multi-paragraph essay, discuss the concept of nuclear physics and practical applications of the properties of the atom. Use appropriate scientific terminology and details in your discussion.

# Using a Musical Instrument to Produce a Mood (pilot)

# Using Geometry to Plan a Memorial Park (pilot)

You are on the Buildings and Grounds Committee in your city and have been assigned the task of creating a memorial park for veterans who have served in the community. The park will consist of a playground, bathrooms, a parking lot, a memorial fountain, and a spotlight for the fountain. The playground, bathrooms, and parking lot will be connected by sidewalks in the shape of a triangle. The memorial fountain will be placed within this triangle, equidistant from the sidewalks that connect the playground, bathrooms, and parking lot. A spotlight for the fountain will be placed equidistant from the playground, bathrooms, and parking lot. A canopy that will be used for the dedication of the park will cover the area between the playground, bathrooms, and parking lot. The balance point of the canopy must be determined for the center pole or the canopy will collapse.

After determining the centroid, incenter, and circumcenter of the triangle of sidewalks connecting the playground, bathrooms, and parking lot, suggest which of these three points would be the best place for the memorial fountain, spotlight, and canopy's center pole. In a multi-paragraph essay, report your findings for the location of the three objects, supporting their locations with the principles of geometry.

## **Using Math to Determine the Better Weekly Pay Rate (pilot)**

Read the math problem.

## **Using Probability to Determine Who Goes First (pilot)**

Kristal proposes that they assign everyone a number and take turns rolling a six-sided die. The player whose number comes up would start the game, and if a 5 or 6 comes up, they roll again.

Clay proposes that they flip 3 coins. If 3 heads come up, Clark would start. If 2 heads come up, Clay would start. If 2 tails come up, Kortney would start. And if 3 tails come up, Kristal would start.

Which of the proposals gives everyone a fair chance of starting the game? Explain your reasoning.

A bag contains a mix of red, yellow, and blue marbles. The ratio of blue to red marbles is 3 to 2, and the ratio of yellow to red marbles is 1 to 4. When 8 blue marbles, 8 red marbles, and 8 yellow marbles are added to the bag, the ratio of blue to red marbles becomes 4 to 3. How many yellow marbles are in the bag after the additional marbles are added? Explain the steps you took to find your answer.

#### **Using Triangles to Find a Plane (pilot)**

The president of the United States has asked you to assist in finding a plane that has gone down over the Indian Ocean. You have been given the task of choosing a tracking system company to find the plane. You want to locate the plane as quickly as possible.

There are four tracking system companies available for use. Each company uses satellites that will take certain measurements to create a triangle around the possible crash site.

The triangle will be formed from the following three points:

- 1. The airport from which the plane departed
- 2. The point where the plane made a counterclockwise turn
- 3. The plane's last known position

Analyze the sample data given by each company to select the one that will find the plane most efficiently. In a multi-paragraph essay, justify your selection of the company to the president. Use the results of your analysis of each company's sample data to support your justification.

Below is sample data given by each company:

# **Company 1:**

Acute Satellite Inc. can provide the following information by using their satellites:

An airplane takes off from Kuala Lumpur going northwest at an angle of 73?. The plane turns counterclockwise 35?. The last known angle is a counterclockwise turn of 72?.

## Company 2:

Right Distance Inc. can provide the following information by using their satellites:

An airplane takes off from Kuala Lumpur going north at an angle of 90?. The plane travels 1,250 km, and then turns counterclockwise 35?.

## **Company 3:**

Butte Inc. can provide the following information by using their satellites:

An airplane takes off from Kuala Lumpur going northwest at an angle of 38?. The plane travels 2,500 km, and then turns counterclockwise and travels another 1,750 km.

### Company 4:

San Antonio Straights Inc. can provide the following information by using their satellites:

An airplane takes off from Kuala Lumpur going northeast at an angle of 121?. The plane travels 2,850 km. The company can give you the distance from the plane's last known location and the airport, which is 4,050 km.

# **Value of Political Gridlock (pilot)**

The term political gridlock can be best described as a time when certain forms of legislation are argued, yet the opinions are evenly divided amongst the two different parties. This leads to an impasse in which little change occurs. Many political historians believe that the Founding Fathers created the four branches of government to force scrutiny of any proposed legislation deemed too radical. Many feel that unless either the republicans or democrats control the majority of the branches, little to no change will occur.

### **Weaknesses Caused by the Articles of Confederation (pilot)**

Following the American Revolution, the American people were very fearful of a strong central government like that of England. As a result, the first American government, which was established under the Articles of Confederation, was so weak it could not survive. After looking over the provisions of the Articles, write a description of three main weaknesses of the government that the Articles established. In separate paragraphs, write about each weakness and the problems caused by that weakness.
