

MY Editor Rule Preferences

MY Editor is an editing tool that assists students in identifying possible errors and provides them with suggestions on improving their writing. Since it does not know the intent of the writer, a student still has to decide if a MY Editor suggestion makes sense and is applicable to writing.

By instructing students to follow the suggestions below, teachers and students will find that MY Editor provides the best suggestions during the editing process.

Remind students that they should do a final review of their writing after they have run MY Editor for the last time to ensure that all spelling, grammatical, and mechanical errors have been corrected. If you or your students find errors that are not detected by MY Editor, send the essay with an error description to support@myaccess.com.

The chart below lists the specific rules identified by MY Editor for each category and at each level. This list can help you choose the most appropriate level for MY Editor feedback for your class.
