Development <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Skillfully integrates reasons and/or reasoning that may be supported by facts, evidence, and/or data from the text(s) • Skillfully integrates elaboration of thoughts that includes original thinking combined with summary, paraphrasing, and/or text evidence to support the argument • 6th grade only: Skillfully acknowledges an alternative perspective 	Content Development/Elaboration <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Very effectively develops arguments with logical reasoning and effectively integrates relevant, text-based evidence to support the writers claim. • Uses a variety of elaborative techniques. • Convincingly addresses opposing claims or counterarguments.
